STATE & LOCAL NEWS

◆ ATHENS POLICE 2016 ANNUAL REPORT

Interim Athens Police Chief Rob Davis has issued his 2016 Annual Report on police activities. The report shows:

- There were 7,566 traffic stops in 2016. Officers issued 5,725 citations and 2,817 warning citations. There were also 1,091 parking tickets issued. Speeding accounted for nearly 30% of the tickets. Running stop signs and failing to wear seat belts each accounted for 15% of the citations. Registration and insurance violations each accounted for 12%, while running red lights made up only 2% of the tickets. The citations brought in \$440,338.00 in revenue. The breakdown of traffic stops by race shows 90% were whites, 6.8% were African Americans, and 2.9% were Hispanics.
- The report shows that 47% of drug seizures in Athens last year were for prescription drugs, 33% were for marijuana, and 20% were for other drugs, such as Meth, Ecstasy, Bath Salts, etc.
- Athens police made 1,316 arrests last year. Arrests from traffic stops totaled 550 (41.8%). Drug arrests totaled 292 (22.1%). Arrests for alcohol violations totaled 120 (9.1%). Nearly 47% of those arrested in 2016 were Athens residents, while 27.8% lived in McMinn County. Violators living outside of McMinn County accounted for 25.3% of the arrests.
- The report says Athens police officers made 573 citizen contacts in the neighborhoods last year. The Citizen Contact program encourages officers to get out of their cars to meet citizens.

National & World News

- ◆ As tensions flare between the United States and North Korea, the number of American citizens detained by the authoritarian government is also rising. Kim Hak Song became the fourth American citizen to be jailed by the repressive regime, on charges such as espionage and "crimes against the state."
- ◆ The United Nations reports that the simmering conflict in South Sudan, has forced more than one million children to seek refuge in neighboring countries, creating one of the most significant refugee crises in the world.
- ◆ Luxury retailer Coach has bagged a deal with its smaller rival, Kate Spade for \$2.4 billion in cash. Kate Spade will continue as an independent brand with its own stores.
