National & World News

- ♦ The U.S. believes the ballistic missile North Korea launched on Saturday was a KN-17 medium range missile. The launch marked the first successful test of the missile. Three previous launches in April had ended in failure.
- ♦ France officially has a new leader, Independent centrist Emmanuel Macron. Macron was inaugurated Sunday morning as the country's new president. He is the youngest president in France's history, and was elected on May 7, beating his far-right rival, Marine Le Pen.
- ◆ Law enforcement and intelligence agencies say the number of reported cyberattacks using the "WannaCry" virus continues to grow. The head of the joint European law enforcement agency, Europol, says the worst may be yet to come.
- ◆ Former Director of National Intelligence James Clapper believes Russia likely sees President Trump's firing of FBI Director James Comey as "another victory on the scoreboard for them."
- ◆ U.S. stocks closed mixed Friday as retail stocks dragged. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed down 22.81 at 20,896.61.The Nasdaq was up 5.27 to close at 6,121.23, and the S&P 500 finished down 3.54 at 2,390.90.
- ◆ Prince William, Duchess Kate and Prince Harry hosted a special garden party on Saturday at Buckingham Palace for children who lost a parent during military service. They welcomed 800 teenagers and young children to Queen Elizabeth's back yard for a fun filled afternoon with their surviving parent.
