♦ FORMER CALHOUN OFFICERS CHARGED

Special agents from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation have obtained indictments against two former members of the Calhoun Police Department. At the request of 10th District Attorney General Stephen Crump, TBI agents began investigating former chief, Julie Tanksley, and former officer, Charles Godsey, on April 8th, 2015. During the course of the investigation, agents developed information that Tanksley and Godsey extorted two people they had arrested by seizing personal property until the arrestees contributed money to the police department's drug fund. The McMinn County Grand Jury returned indictments, charging Tanksley and Godsey with two counts of Extortion. They were arrested, and then released on \$4,000 bond. They are pictured below, with Tanksley on the left and Godsey on the right. Tanksley is currently the police chief of Graysville, TN.





National & World News

- ◆ President Trump called for unity in the fight to "stomp out Islamic extremism" in a speech to the leaders of 50 Muslim countries in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, on Sunday. Trump described extremism as a "battle between good and evil." He called on the leaders to "drive out the terrorists from your places of worship."
- ◆ North Korea fired a medium-range missile over the weekend. The missile traveled about 310 miles and landed in the Sea of Japan.
- ◆ The City of New Orleans has removed a statue of Gen. Robert E. Lee, the last of four Confederate monuments in the city.
