#### **Fire Destroys Cantrell Building**

A part of Downtown Athens history went up in flames Saturday morning. A passerby saw smoke and flames coming from the roof of the former Larry Cantrell law office building at the corner of Jackson and Washington on the Courthouse Square at 5:30 a.m. The Cantrell building was destroyed, but firemen were able to prevent flames from spreading to adjoining buildings. However, Johnsons Home Furnishings, Greeks Bearing Gifts, and the Athens Chamber of Commerce office received substantial smoke and water damage. The Cantrell building had been undergoing remodeling, and was to have been the location of attorney Jim Logan's new Athens office. Logan says he will rebuild. Saturday afternoon, authorities made the decision to remove the top floor of the building due to safety concerns. The building was constructed in 1876 by Emily McKeldin. She was the widow of Andrew McKeldin, who had moved to McMinn County from Ireland. The building was home to the McKeldin store. Later, Proffitt's Department Store was located there. Fire inspectors have determined that the fire started in the back interior corner of the building. They say it does not appear to be arson. Firefighters from 15 fire departments responded: Athens City, Cleveland, Etowah City, Calhoun, Madisonville, Decatur, Englewood Rural, Etowah Rural, Athens Rural, Riceville Rural, Tri-Community, Meigs County, Signal Mountain, Highway 58, and East Ridge fire departments. Athens Utilities Board cut power and natural gas, and pumped 4100 gallons of water per minute throughout the morning.
