♦ COUNCIL VOTES TO HIRE CONSULTANT

The Athens City Council voted 4-1 Tuesday night to hire a consultant to take a look at the Athens City Schools and make a recommendation about whether to close two of the existing schools or make repairs to the current schools. Vice Mayor Dick Pelley cast the lone no vote. City Manager C. Seth Sumner says he expects the consultant will have a recommendation in about six months. In other action, the Council voted 4-1 to re-appoint banker Tom Hughes to the AUB Board.

The Council also got the monthly activity reports for June from the police and fire departments. Interim Police Chief Rob Davis reported there were 58 thefts in Athens in June, 15 assaults, 12 burglaries, four motor vehicle thefts, and three robberies. Officers issued 358 citations for moving violations. There were 77 traffic accidents in June, with 6 injuries. Davis also gave a breakdown on the 58 thefts. Of those, 21 were shoplifting, 14 were thefts from a building, seven were thefts from motor vehicles, six were thefts of vehicle parts or accessories, and one was a purse snatching.

Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that Athens firefighters responded
to 54 calls in June. Losses totaled \$778,000. The losses included
\$525,000 from a day care center on Old Riceville Road and
\$200,000 from a fire at DENSO. Firefighters responded to one
commercial fire, one industrial fire, two residential fires, nine
vehicle accidents, and 14 false alarms in June.



ATHENS POLICE ISSUE U-TURN RULES

Athens Police reminds citizens that most U-Turns made in the city are a violation of Tennessee State Law and the Athens Municipal Code. The Drivers Manual states that drivers **MAY NOT** make a U-Turn at any of the following locations:

- At any intersection where a traffic light or police officer is controlling the traffic flow.
- At any location where you cannot see traffic coming from both directions for at least 500 feet in each direction.
- At any location where signs prohibit U-Turns.
- Between intersections in the city.
- On an Interstate Highway. The crossovers are for emergency vehicles and highway maintenance crews only.
