Local and Area News

♦ COUNCIL GETS POLICE/FIRE REPORTS

The Athens City Council held its monthly meeting Tuesday evening. They presented the VIVID (Very Important Volunteer Individual) Award to the Athens Lions Club for its work in bringing the RAM Clinic to Athens. The council also authorized a contract to hire a design and engineering firm for the Splash Pad to be constructed in the Regional Park.

The council also received the monthly reports on July activity from the police and fire departments.

Interim Police Chief Rob Davis reported there were 59 thefts in July, 13 burglaries, 10 assaults, six motor vehicle thefts, two robberies, and two sex offenses. Police issued citations for 275 moving violations. There were 63 traffic accidents in Athens in July, with 12 injuries. There are currently six vacancies on the Police Department.

Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 57 calls in July. Estimated losses were \$1,143,100. Most of those losses were a result of the July 1st fire in Downtown Athens.

◆ COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE CLOSED TODAY

The McMinn County Clerk's office closed at 4 p.m. Wednesday for the move to the new Courthouse Annex. However, there are not enough data ports at the new office. County Clerk Evonne Hayes says she plans to open in the new location as soon as possible, but it may be as late as next Tuesday morning. She says she has to close the old office so Food City can do demolition work.

National - World News

- ♠ A new analysis of satellite photos taken two weeks after Malaysian Airlines Flight MH-370 mysteriously vanished may help scientists narrow the search area. The "drift analysis" by Australian scientists tracks 12 floating objects that could be from the plane. The analysis may help scientists narrow the search area to three regions in the southern Indian Ocean. The Boeing 777 with 239 passengers and crew aboard disappeared in March of 2014.
- ◆ President Trump says North Korea's Kim Jong Un made a "very wise" decision in backing down on his threats of a missile attack on Guam. Trump tweeted that the alternative would have been both catastrophic and unacceptable. He commented a day after North Korean media reported the dictator had delayed a decision about whether to fire missiles toward Guam.
- ◆ Dolly Parton will release her first album of original children's music next month, with all the proceeds going to her Imagination Library, that gives free books to kids. The CD is titled "I Believe In You," and contains 14 songs including "Coat of Many Colors."
