STATE & LOCAL NEWS

♦ BELL TO ATTEND HISTORIC CONVENTION

State Senator Mike Bell of Riceville is among eight Tennessee legislators who will join delegates from across the nation in Phoenix, Arizona, on September 12th at the Balanced Budget Amendment Planning Convention. This gathering will be the first national convention of the states to be convened since 1861, when states met to discuss an amendment they hoped would avert civil war. The purpose of the upcoming convention in Phoenix is to prepare for an anticipated convention convened under Article V of the U.S. Constitution to propose a balanced budget amendment and to recommend a set of rules under which such a convention would be governed.

◆ STORMS KEEP AUB HOPPING

Lightning during the thunderstorms that roared across McMinn County Tuesday afternoon kept AUB repair crews busy. Spokesman Wayne Scarbrough says a lightning strike on County Road 439 knocked out 21 customers. Lightning in the area of Richardson and Oak Streets affected 164 customers. A lightning strike in the area of Million Street knocked out 155 customers. A downed tree on County Road 439 affected 17 customers. Lightning also caused a structure fire on Shadows Lawn Drive.

It wasn't lightning, but a vehicle that took down a power pole Wednesday morning on County Road 500 just outside Englewood. That resulted in a fairly large outage for customers as crews repaired the damage.

National - World News

- ◆ Hurricane Irma lashed the Caribbean on Wednesday, causing at least three deaths. Farther north in the U.S., Florida, Georgia and South Carolina are facing states of emergency as residents brace for the monster storm.
- ◆ A top North Korean diplomat called his country's recent nuclear test a "gift package" for the United States and promised more to come if the U.S. continues what he called its "reckless provocations." North Korea claims it tested a hydrogen bomb on Sunday, the country's sixth nuclear test.
- ◆ A Swiss chocolate company has unveiled a fourth type of chocolate called "Ruby Chocolate." It naturally has a pink hue. The chocolate contains no berries, berry flavoring or added color to achieve its color and taste.

◆ BB Gun Found at Athens Middle School

An unloaded BB pistol was found in a student's backpack at Athens City Middle School Wednesday morning. Principal Mike Simmons sent a text message to parents advising them of the situation. He said he was given information that led to the discovery of the BB gun. He said the student will be disciplined.
