• One student is dead and three others are injured after a school shooting near Spokane, Washington. The shooter has been apprehended and is in custody. The wounded were transported to a local hospital and are expected to survive.

• Eight people are dead after Hurricane Irma knocked out air conditioning at a nursing home in Hollywood, Florida. The causes of their deaths were not immediately clear. The entire facility was evacuated due to the cooling issues. All patients were evacuated to hospitals. The deaths are under investigation.
