CLIFF COUCH IS NEW APD POLICE CHIEF

The new Athens police chief will be Cliff Couch. Athens City Manager C. Seth Sumner announced his choice to replace retired chief, Chuck Ziegler, at a news conference at Athens City Hall Thursday afternoon. Couch is a native of Tallahassee, Florida, and is currently serving as the police chief in Great Bend, Kansas. He has a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Florida



State University. He will be sworn into office as Police Chief of Athens in October. Before announcing his choice, Sumner praised Captain Rob Davis, who served as Interim Chief.

Sumner announced that a resident of Athens, Ben Burchfield, is his choice to be Public Works Di-

rector. Burchfield came to Athens to work with Norfolk Southern Railway. He is a Civil Engineering graduate from the University of Alabama-Birmingham. He will assume his duties as Athens Public Works Director on October 2nd. Sumner praised Street Department Supervisor April Johnston for her service as the Interim Public Works Director since January. As City Manager, Sumner has the authority to appoint department heads, so his choices do not require approval by the Athens City Council

◆ Investigators are awaiting autopsy results as they work to piece together details of what led to the killing of Laura Wallen, a pregnant Maryland high school teacher found dead nine days after being reported missing. Wallen's boyfriend, Tyler Tessier, was arrested and charged in her slaving.

◆ The death toll from Hurricane Irma continued to climb Thursday in the United States. At least 31 people have died in three states.

• One soldier is dead and seven more injured in a demolitions training mishap at a Fort Bragg, North Carolina, firing range. The injuries were caused by an explosion, and is under investigation.
