♦ WACKER TO CLOSE FOR A FEW MONTHS

The Wacker chemical plant, where an explosion occurred two weeks ago today, will likely remain closed for several months. Wacker Polysilicon global president Tobias Brandis issued a news release on Wednesday saying the Charleston facility will not restart production until a thorough inspection is completed and it's certain the facility is safe. He says workers will support repair efforts and undergo advanced training courses. Wacker's investigation into the Sept. 7th explosion found that a technical defect prompted a hydrogen leak that caught fire. Damaged piping leaked chlorosilane, which created hydrogen chloride when it contacted moisture in the air. The explosion and chemical release briefly closed Interstate 75 and prompted shelter-in-place orders for nearby residents and schools.

National - World News

- Rescuers continue to dig through the rubble of a collapsed school in Mexico City a day after a 7.1 magnitude earthquake struck, killing more than 200 people.
- ◆ Two more men were arrested by the London Metropolitan police early Wednesday in connection with last week's bombing of a subway car in Parsons Green.
- ◆ Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell is hoping to hold a vote on the Graham-Cassidy health care proposal next week. Republicans have until September 30 to vote on a health care bill under budget reconciliation that would allow them to pass a bill with a simple majority of 50 votes.
- ◆ All of Puerto Rico was without power by Wednesday afternoon, just hours after Hurricane Maria made landfall on the island as a Category 4 storm. Puerto Rico Office of Emergency Management Agency confirmed that 100 percent of the U.S. territory has lost power.
