Local & State News

◆ FORREST STATUE TO STAY PUT, FOR NOW

The statue of Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest will remain in a city park in Memphis, at least for the time being. The Tennessee Historical Commission, meeting at the McMinn Living Heritage Museum in Athens last Friday, overwhelmingly voted to deny a request by Memphis Mayor Jim Strickland (in photo below) to remove the statue. Memphis officials say they will turn to

the courts as they continue their efforts to move the statue. The museum was crowded with people on both sides of the issue. There were state troopers and officers from the Athens Police De-



partment and the McMinn County Sheriff's Office inside the meeting room and outside the Museum to ensure that the proceedings were peaceful. The Commission heard from Mayor Strickland and others calling for the removal of the statue as well as arguments from those opposed to moving it. The meeting was scheduled six months ago to be held in Athens on October 13th. The Historical Commission has a practice of moving its quarterly meetings from one city to another.
