• President Trump says his relationship with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is one that "has never been closer," and Abe has described Trump as "a leader who I can have great confidence in." The two leaders played a round of golf together in Toyko on Sunday. Trump and Abe talked about dealing with North Korea. • President Trump says he expects to meet face-to-face with Russian President Vladimir Putin next week. It will take place in Da Nang, Vietnam, where both Trump and Putin will participate in the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit. The meeting has been in the works for several weeks.

### **BELK ROBBERS ARRESTED**

Two people who stole 10 expensive purses from Belk's Department store in Athens the last weekend in October have been arrested. The pair fought with store employees and a local shopper from Athens who tried to stop them. Police in Cartersville, Georgia say the same pair and another woman entered the Belk store there on October 22nd and tried to steal Brahmin purses, which are valued at \$300 each. A Belk employee confronted one of the female suspects to try and stop her from stealing the purses. The male suspect then shoved the Belk employee to the ground and all three suspects fled the store in a silver Dodge Magnum. Eyewitnesses helped police identify the suspects; Letisha Green, Lateefah Johnson, and Rodney Reese. (See below) Warrants were issued for robbery by force and felony shoplifting. Two of them were arrested by Chattanooga police, Letisha Green and Rodney Reece, who were taken into custody on November 1st. Lateefah Johnson is still at large.
