TODAY IN HISTORY - NOVEMBER 21st

- 1783 Jean Francois Pilatre de Rozier and the Marquis Francois Laurant d'Arlandes made the first flight in a balloon, thus becoming the first men to fly period. The pair flew nearly six miles around Paris in 25 minutes reaching an altitude of around 300 feet. Ben Franklin was one of the spectators at the big event. The flight came less than six months after the first (unmanned) public balloon demonstration.
- **1789** North Carolina became the 12th state to ratify the U.S. Constitution.
- **1922** Rebecca L. Felton of Georgia was sworn in as the first woman to serve in the U.S. Senate.
- **1973** President Richard Nixon's attorney, J. Fred Buzhardt, revealed the existence of an 18 1/2-minute gap in one of the White House tape recordings related to Watergate.
- **1995** The Beatles' *Anthology I* sold 450,000 copies in its first day of release. According to Capitol Records, it was the most single-day sales ever for an album. Yeah, yeah, yeah...
- **1995** The Dow Jones industrial average closed above 5,000 for the first time.
- **2002 -** NATO invited seven former communist countries to join the alliance: Slovenia, Slovakia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania and Bulgaria.
