MISSING GIRL TURNS HERSELF IN

The 17-year-old Athens girl who was the subject of an endangered child alert issued by the TBI and a suspect in a botched robbery attempt at the Athens Lodge Sunday morning has turned herself in. Detective Fred Shultz says one of Devin Skye Hester's friends picked her up in Madisonville and brought her to the Athens Police Department. Police say they believe drugs were the motive for the robbery attempt. Devin's parents say she has a history of drug issues and has been involved in a rehab program.

♦ THP RELEASES NAMES OF WRECK VICTIMS

The Tennessee Highway Patrol has released the names of the two Etowah men who were killed in a fiery head-on collision on Highway 411 near Etowah early Sunday morning. The THP says they were George P. Alden, 65, and Terry L. Vaughn, Jr., 44. The THP says Alden was driving south when he crossed the center line and hit Vaughn's vehicle head-on. Both men died at the scene.
