EARLY VOTING STARTS TODAY

Today is the first day of early voting for the county primaries. Early voting runs from April 11th through 26th. Election day is May 1st. In McMinn County, there are no contested races on the Democratic ballot. On the Republican ballot, there are contested races for McMinn County commission in the 1st, 2nd, and 5th districts. None of the other offices are contested, including Sheriff, County Mayor, Register, and Highway Commissioner. Early voting takes place at the Election Commission office at the McMinn County Courthouse. The hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday-Wednesday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and 8:30 a.m. to noon on Saturday.

◆ California is the only border state that has not announced deployment of its National Guard to the U.S.-Mexico border. Texas, New Mexico and Arizona have announced a combined 1,588 Guardsmen to support President Trump's new border security mission.

◆ President Donald Trump, France's President Emmanuel Macron and U.K. Prime Minister Theresa May held phone conversations earlier this week to discuss how the West should act in order to reinforce an international prohibition against chemical warfare. They are weighing a coordinated military response against the Syrian government over an alleged chemical attack on a rebelheld neighborhood near Damascus this past weekend.
