## **♦** AUB WATER EXCEEDS ALL STANDARDS

Athens Utilities Board has released its annual water Quality Report for 2017. The report shows AUB's water quality exceeded all state and federal water quality standards. AUB's drinking water comes from Ingleside Spring and from wells that tap an underground aquifer that parallels Oostanaula Creek. A third water source is the Hiwassee Utility Commission, which provides treated surface water from the Hiwassee River.

The City of Athens received Tree City USA status for the 37th consecutive year. The award was announced at the Arbor Day celebration held on April 5th at the Quad on the TWU campus.

- ◆ An infant was found dead in a suitcase near train tracks in Jersey City, New Jersey, Wednesday afternoon about 1:15 p.m. under an overpass by the PATH trains near the Journal Square station.
- ◆ If confirmed, Marine Corps Col. Lorna M. Mahlock will be the first African-American female to serve as brigadier general. Secretary of Defense James Mattis made the announcement on Tuesday for the president.
- ◆ The U.S. and its allies are "still assessing the intelligence" needed to prove the Assad regime conducted a recent alleged chemical attack in Syria.
- ◆ A woman walking her dog in Canarsie Park in Brooklyn, New York on Monday night discovered a woman's dismembered body. Her arms and legs were later discovered strewn over 132 acres of the park. The woman had not been reported missing, and police have identified her as 26 year old Brandy Odom.

## 1320 Pounds of Waste

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation reports that a total of 1,320 pounds of hazardous household waste was turned in last Saturday at the Household Hazardous Waste Event held at the Etowah City School. Thirty-three households participated. They turned in 348 pounds of poisonous material such as pesticides and herbicides; 310 pounds of flammable liquids such as lighter fluid, gasoline, and lamp oils; 106 pounds of Aerosols containing spray paint and cleaners; 100 pounds of Fluorescent Lamps; 62 pounds of Corrosive Material such as oven cleaner, bleach, and Drano; and 8 pounds of Sharps (needles).
