◆ MONROE CO. MAN HELD IN CARJACKING

A Monroe County man, 25-year-old Brandon McGrail, has been booked into the McMinn County Jail on \$168,000 bond on charges of vehicular assault, carjacking, and aggravated robbery. Sheriff Joe Guy says deputies were called to County Road 879 near Etowah last Friday night. They found Benjamin Crofts lying in the road. He told them he had given a ride to McGrail and whey they got to County Road 879, McGrail pulled a

handgun and threatened him unless he gave him some money. The two struggled before Croft's car crashed into a barn. Croft suffered minor injuries, and McGrail fled the scene. Sheriff Guy says with evidence they collected and from the car through social media, officers were able to locate McGrail (shown

in mug shot) in Monroe County.

National & World News

◆ As of Monday morning, Hawaii Civil Defense reported that a total of 31 structures were destroyed by the lava from the Hawaiian Volcano. No injuries have been reported. Residents also face the danger of the toxic sulfur dioxide gas that is being emitted by the lava fountains.

• President Trump will announce his decision on the Iran nuclear deal Tuesday at 2 p.m. at the White House.

◆ On Monday, Vladimir Putin was sworn in for a fourth term as Russia's president in an elaborate ceremony at the Kremlin. Putinhas been in power for almost two decades.

◆ According to a new FBI report, twenty-one states from California to Maryland, saw active shooter incidents in the two-year period from 2016 to 2017. This is ten more than in the previous two-year period. An active shooter is one or more individuals actively engaging in killing or attempting to kill people in a populated area.

AUB Checking for Gas Leaks

Athens Utilities Board will increase the operating pressure of its natural gas distribution system in sections of Athens and surrounding areas this week. The purpose is to check for leaks along the service lines right up to the gas meter. By increasing the oper-

ating pressure (a process called "uprating") the risk of cold weather service interruptions is significantly decreased. The increased pressure will expose any possible leaks which can be corrected. The area involved includes the Highway 39 East corridor including all of Cumberland Hills and a section of Athens from Veterans Park to Slack Road to the airport.
