

### TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 6TH

**1755** - American patriot Nathan Hale was born. He was hanged by the British as a spy. His final words were: "I only regret that I have but one life to lose for my country."

**1833-** The first U.S. president to ride in a railroad car was Andrew Jackson.

**1844 -** The Young Men's Christian Association, or YMCA, was founded on this date in London.

**1896** - Two Americans, George Harbo and Frank Samuelson, began rowing their two-man boat across the Atlantic. They arrived in Sicily UK on August 1st.

**1925 -** Walter Percy Chrysler founded the Chrysler Corp.

1932 - The first U.S. federal tax on gasoline was enacted.

**1944 -** Hundreds of thousands of allied troops began crossing the English Channel in the historic "D-Day" invasion of Nazi-occupied Europe.

**1968 -** Sen. Robert F. Kennedy died at Good Samaritan Hospital in Los Angeles, a day after he was shot by Sirhan Bishara Sirhan.
