# National & World News

◆ North Korean leader Kim Jong Un arrived in Beijing Tuesday morning for his third visit to China in less than three months, one week after his historic summit with President Trump in Singapore. The visit comes on the same day Washington and Seoul announced that they would suspend a joint military exercise in August.

◆ Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Nikki Haley announced Tuesday that the U.S. will withdraw from the United Nations Human Rights Council. The U.S. has been calling for reform, and accusing the UNHRC of an anti-Israel bias. Haley accused the body of "attacking countries that uphold human rights and shielding countries that abuse human rights." The withdrawal was something under long consideration.
