♦ COUNCIL GETS POLICE & FIRE REPORTS

The members of the Athens City Council heard the police and fire department reports on activity for the month of May at Tuesday evening's council meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 66 thefts in May, 19 assaults, 17 burglaries, 10 motor vehicle thefts, two sex offenses, and one robbery. There were 96 traffic accidents with nine injuries. Police issued 232 citations for moving violations. There are two vacancies on the police department.
- Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 60 calls in May. One call was to a residential fire, one to an industrial fire, one each to grass, trash and vehicle fires, 13 to vehicle accidents, and 16 false alarms. Damage from fires in May totaled \$46,800.
