◆ ATHENS MAN FACES MURDER CHARGE

A joint investigation by the TBI, the Madisonville Police Department, the Tennessee Highway Patrol, and several other law en-

forcement agencies has resulted in the arrest of Paul Shane Strickland of Athens (Photo to the right) on a homicide charge. Authorities say Strickland is charged with the shooting death of Christopher Garrett, 26, of Madisonville. The TBI says its investigation shows Garrett was in the passenger seat of a vehi-



cle traveling in the 3700 block of Highway 411. A female was driving. Strickland was in the back seat. The TBI says the two men got into an argument and the female heard a popping sound and saw Garrett slump over in the seat. As the woman tried to drive Garrett to a hospital, her vehicle collided with another vehicle on Highway 411. Strickland ran from the vehicle and into a wooded area, where he was ultimately apprehended and charged with Criminal Homicide.

◆ A teenager wanted in the fatal shooting of a Georgia police officer was killed by police Monday morning. Tafahree Maynard, 18, was killed after he refused to drop a lawn mower blade when police found him hiding in a shed in Snellville, Georgia.

♦ BURLARY SUSPECT SHOT BY PROPERTY OWNER A burglary suspect was shot by the property owner on County Road 675 Sunday. Sheriff Joe Guy says Michael Beverly discovered two suspects ransacking his outbuilding. While he held them at gun point, one of them—identified as 36-year-old Donnie Hicks—assaulted him. Beverly then defended himself with his handgun and shot Hicks, who was treated at a Knoxville hospital. The other burglary suspect fled the scene, but was captured about an hour later in a field along County Road 700. He is 30-year-old Gary D. Blankenship. Both suspects will face charges related to the theft. Blankenship was already wanted for his involvement in a child abduction case in Overton County last week.
