Local & Area News

◆ UNEMPLOYMENT DECLINES IN THE AREA

Unemployment in November was down in all 95 counties in Tennessee. Here in the Athens area, the jobless rate in McMinn County was 3.9% in November, down from 4.2% in October. Meigs County's unemployment rate in November was 4.2%, down from 4.6% in October. Monroe County posted a 3.5% unemployment rate in November. That was down from 3.8% in October. Polk County's jobless rate in November was 3.8%, down from 4.2% in October. Bradley County recorded an unemployment rate in November of 3.4%, down from 3.7% in October.

◆ NEW LAWS IN EFFECT IN TENNESSEE

With the beginning of a new year, over 30 new laws take effect in Tennessee. One law prohibits state and local government entities and officials from adopting sanctuary policies. Another law requires the Tennessee Department of Health to create a way to report opioid abuse. Wine and beverage sales will now be allowed on Sunday in restaurants during certain hours. However, they will be prohibited on Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

NO CALLS FOR RIDES: McMinn County 911 dispatchers say not a single person took advantage of Sheriff Joe Guy's offer to provide a free ride home for party-goers who had too much to drink New Year's Eve. The only free rides were given to those who were arrested for Driving Under the Influence. Their free ride was to the McMinn County Jail.

- ◆ President Trump has invited congressional leaders to a briefing Wednesday on "border security" at the White House. This will be the first sit-down meeting between Trump and Democratic leaders Nancy Pelosi and Chuck Schumer in 22 days.
- ◆ Seven-year-old Jazmine Barnes, was killed when an unknown suspect pulled up next to her mother's car on Sunday morning in Harris County Texas and began shooting. The mother was wounded during the incident. The suspect was described as a bearded white man, possibly in his 40s, wearing a red hoodie and driving a four-door, red or maroon pickup truck.
- ◆ North Korean Communist Dictator Kim Jong Un says he is ready to sit down again with President Donald Trump, but warned the United States against imposing more sanctions.
