
#### DID YOU KNOW THIS?

It is unlawful to shoot a "BB" gun inside the City of Athens. According to Section 11-601 of the Athens City Ordinance, "It shall be unlawful for any person in the municipality to discharge any air gun, air pistol, air rifle, "BB" gun, or sling shot capable of discharging a metal bullet or pellet, whether propelled by spring, compressed air, expanding gas, explosive or other forceproducing means or method.

## **Flying With the Presidents**

George Coleman of Cleveland has had a unique career in the Air Force. Coleman, who is now 84, was a Master Sergeant in the Air Force and was assigned to the President's plane, Air Force One, from 1969 to 1977. During that time, he flew with Presidents Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford. Coleman's job was communications and navigation. One of his jobs was to set up phone

calls for the presidents to make from Air Force One in the days before cell phones. In an interview with WYXI Radio. Coleman said the crew of Air Force One did not talk to the President, even if they passed each other in the cabin of the plane. He said you only spoke when you were spoken to. He recalled one flight he made to China to pick up Senator John Glenn and fly him



back to Washington. Coleman said Glenn sat down with him in the cockpit and they talked for about 30 minutes about matters of flying, space, and faith.
