BELL TO CHAIR JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

State Senator Mike Bell of Riceville has been appointed Chairman of the powerful Senate Judiciary Committee. Lt. Chris Marinello, her husband, said his family had been friends with the pilot for over 20 years and he felt it was safe for his wife to go flying with him.
