FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks ended the day higher after President Trump announced a short-term funding deal to reopen the government. In corporate news, shares of Intel were down more than five percent. U.S. Treasuries rose, and for the week The Dow Jones Industrial Average was mostly flat, rising 31 points.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 184 points or 0.8% to 24,737. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 22 points or 0.9% to 2,665, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 91 points or 1.3% to 7,165.

TODAY IN HISTORY - January 28th

1547 – England's King Henry VIII died.

1878 - The first commercial telephone switchboard went into operation in New Haven, Connecticut. It initially served 12 subscribers.

1909 - The United States ended direct control over Cuba.

1915 - The Coast Guard was created by an act of Congress.

1929 - Clarinet player Acker Bilk was born. His biggest hit record was "Stranger On the Shore."

1956 - Elvis Presley made his first appearance on national television on *The Dorsey Brothers Show*, starring Tommy and Jimmy. Elvis sang *Blue Suede Shoes* and *Heartbreak Hotel*. He was backed by the instruments of the Dorsey band.
