EMPLOYMENT UP IN ATHENS AREA

Every county in the Athens area recorded an increase in employment from November to December, with the exception of Meigs County. The unemployment rate in Athens was 3.6% in December, down from 3.9% in November. Meigs County's jobless rate was 4.3% in both November and December. Monroe County's unemployment rate was 3.2% in December, down from 3.5% in November. Polk County's jobless rate in December was 3.5%, down from 3.8% in November. In Bradley County unemployment in December was 2.9%, down from 3.3% in November. Statewide, seventy-six counties saw a decrease in unemployment.

MEIGS CO. GETS CLEAN AUDIT REPORT

Tennessee Comptroller Justin P. Wilson has announced that eight Tennessee counties have achieved a distinctive honor. They all received a clean audit report for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 2018. The counties include Meigs, Roane, Blount, and Sevier. All eight annual audits were completed without any findings. Only a select number of Tennessee counties will receive an audit report without a finding indicating weaknesses or deficiencies in government operations. Only 13 counties audited by the Comptroller's Office received clean audit reports in fiscal year 2017. The eight clean reports for fiscal year 2018 were among the first round of audits to have been released. The audit reports from other counties, including McMinn County, will be released later.

On a Snowy January Morn

A blanket of snow turned Tuesday morning to a black and white winter wonderland. Snow fall ranging from 11/4 to 2 inches in the Athens area covered lawns, decks, roof and car tops, but mostly left the roadways untouched. All the schools were called off for the day and that helped to keep traffic off the roads. In addition, brine had been sprayed on the main Athens streets in advance. - Patricia Arnett, age 67, of Athens, died Monday at her home. Funeral arrangements will be announced by Companion Funeral Home of Athens.



TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks finished the day mixed as investors weighed the latest earnings and the odds of a trade breakthrough between the U.S. and China. Technology shares declined ahead of corporate earnings this week.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 52 points or 0.2% to 24,580. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 4 points or 0.2% to 2,640, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 57 points or 0.8% to 7,028.
