Coming Soon: Real-ID Licenses

Tennessee's Driver Services will start issuing Real-ID driver licenses beginning July 1st. The Real-ID compliant cards will be needed to fly on airplanes, go into federal buildings, or enter mili-

tary bases effective October 1st. 2020. The new ID cards marked are with a gold circle with a white star in the center. The Real-ID designed



to make driver's licenses less susceptible to forgery by requiring proof of U.S. residency. Non-compliant driver licenses and identification cards issued beginning July 1st will display the phrase "NOT FOR FEDERAL IDENTIFICATION" on the front. You DO NOT need a Real-ID to drive, vote, purchase alcohol or cigarettes, or apply for federal benefits such as social security or veterans' benefits. You can still fly without a Real-ID card, but you must have another acceptable form of identification such as a passport.
