## **♦** WHEN DOES THE TAX INCREASE TAKE EFFECT?

Voters approved a .75% increase in the local sales tax in Athens on Tuesday. In case you're wondering when the tax increase takes effect, it will be next January. The sales tax collections are sent to the state, which then returns 2.75% to the city. It will be next March before that tax money is received by Athens. As for an increase in the property tax, that will be up to the Athens City Council. Any property tax hike will not take place until the next spring at the earliest. Moming Fax\*


