More Community News You Can Use

- ✓ The Cherokee Beekeepers Association will have their monthly meeting next Tuesday, August 27th, at 7 p.m. The meeting will be held at AgCentral Farmers Co-Op on Congress Parkway.
- ✓ The McMinn County Election Commission will have a called meeting next Monday, August 26th, at 12 noon in the Conference Room of the Courthouse. The purpose of the meeting will be to certify the City of Athens Sales Tax Referendum, election payroll, and any other business to legally come before the board.
- ✓ Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch reports there were 45 thefts in Athens in July, 16 assaults, nine motor vehicle thefts, eight burglaries, and one sex offense. Officers issued citations for 139 moving violations. There were 98 traffic accidents in the city in July, with seven injuries. There is one vacancy on the police department.
- ✓ Athens Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reports that firefighters responded to 65 calls in July. Twenty-one calls were for rescue and emergency medical service. There were four calls to fires, five "hazardous condition" calls (no fires), and 28 false alarms. The fire department also took part in the July 4th show at the Athens Regional Park and held a "Touch a Truck" event at the Athens Walmart. Chief Ainsworth says losses from fires in July totaled \$2,750.00.
