Groundbreaking at Higher Ed Center

◆ Governor Bill Lee and other dignitaries were in Athens Friday to participate in the official groundbreaking ceremony of the new McMinn Higher Education Center. The new \$17.75 million campus will have expanded facilities for the Tennessee College of Applied Technology, Cleveland State Community College and the U.T. Agriculture Extension Office. The project was proposed about 7 years ago and was approved by the state in June. FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks edged lower after news outlets reported that the White House is considering curbing U.S. investments into China. August household spending came in below expectations and inflation slowed. Wells Fargo shares rose after the company appointed a new CEO following a six-month search. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fell 114 points for the week. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 71 points or 0.3% to 26,820. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 16 points or 0.5% to 2,962, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 91 points or 1.1% to 7,940.
