MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities closed higher. The energy sector was the biggest decliner. China's September manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index climbed. Treasury prices rose. Interest rates declined.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 97 points or 0.4% to 26,917. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 15 points or 0.5% to 2,977, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 60 points or 0.8% to 7,999.

Another Joe Guy History Moment

The historic Old Federal Road that passes through eastern McMinn County was built in 1804 by the Cherokee Nation as a route of commerce between the white settlements north of the Little Tennessee River and those south of the Cherokee Nation in Georgia. But this old road may lie along a route that is eons older. McMinn County was once crossed by ancient trails, driven into the ground by herds of ancient animals, including Bison and elk that once migrated up and down the Tennessee Valley.

When Native Americans came to the area, they too used these well-worn paths as routes to trade and make war with other native tribes. The main trail running southeast by northwest with the natural ridges was later known as the Great Indian Warpath.

While it is difficult today to know the exact route of this old pathway, it is believed by many historians that when the Cherokees built the Federal Road, they simply followed the route of the old War Path, widening it for wagons and establishing toll gates along its length. Few drivers on the Old Federal Road today realize the ancient path their modern vehicles are following.

TODAY IN HISTORY

1878 - General Lew Wallace was sworn in as governor of the New Mexico Territory. He went on to deal with the notorious outlaw, Billy the Kid, and to write the novel, *Ben Hur*.

1880 - A new director of the United States Marine Corps Band was named. John Philip Sousa became the band's 17th leader. In 1888 he composed *Semper Fidelis*, traditionally known as the official march of the Marine Corps.

1890 - Yosemite National Park was dedicated in California.

1908 - The Ford Model T, which was introduced by Henry Ford, went on sale. More than 15 million Model T's were eventually sold, all of them black. The cost for the Model T was \$825.00

1924 - Jimmy Carter was born in Plains, Georgia. He went from a peanut farmer to a state senator to governor and in 1977 became the 39th president.

1926 - Pianist Roger Williams was born. His biggest hit records were "Autumn Leaves" and "Near You."

1935 - Actress and singer Julie Andrews was born. Her movies include "Mary Poppins" and "The Sound of Music."

1962 - "From New York ... heeeeeeeeeeer's Johnny!" Ed McMahon introduced the new host of NBC's *Tonight Show* for the first time. Johnny Carson entertained late-night America for nearly three decades.

1971 - Walt Disney World opened in Orlando, Florida.

1974 - Five Nixon aides, including John Ehrlichman and Nixon's Chief of Staff H.R. Haldeman went on trial for conspiring to hinder the Watergate investigation.

SOCIAL SECUITY SCAMS

If you receive a call from someone pretending to be from the Social Security Administration (SSA) and they try to get your Social Security number or your money, it's a scam.

Scammers will tell you that your Social Security number (SSN) has been suspended because of suspicious activity, or because it's been involved in a crime. Sometimes, the scammer wants you to confirm your SSN to reactivate it or will say your bank account is about to be seized and will proceed to tell you what to do to keep it safe. If this happens to you, here's what you need to know:

- Your Social Security number is not about to be suspended.
 You don't have to verify your number to anyone who calls out of the blue. And your bank accounts are not about to be seized.
- ♦ SSA will never call to threaten your benefits or tell you to wire money, send cash, or put money on gift cards. Anyone who tells you to do those things is a scammer. Every time.
- ♦ The real SSA number is 1-800-772-1213, but scammers are putting that number in the caller ID. If you're worried about what the caller says, hang up and call 1-800-772-1213 to speak to the real SSA. Even if the wait time is long, confirm with the real SSA before responding to one of these calls.
- Never give any part of your Social Security number to anyone who contacts you. Never reveal your bank account or credit card numbers.
