◆ POLICE & FIRE ACTIVITY IN AUGUST

Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch reports there were 65 thefts in the city in August. There were 17 burglaries, eight assaults, three sex offenses, three motor vehicle thefts, and one robbery. Police issued 146 citations for moving violations. There were 83 traffic accidents in August with 12 injuries.

Athens Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth says firefighters responded to 56 calls in August. The bulk of those calls, 22, were for rescue and emergency medical service. There were 5 fire calls and 18 false alarms. Losses from fires in August totaled \$6,000.

♦ McMINN POLICE GET SAFETY GRANTS

The Tennessee Highway Safety Office has awarded grants to law enforcement agencies in McMinn County. The Athens Police Department will receive a \$20,000 grant for Alcohol and Impaired Driving Enforcement. The McMinn County Sheriff's Department will also receive \$20,000 for Alcohol and Impaired Driving Enforcement. The Etowah and Niota Police Departments each will receive \$5,000 grants for High Visibility Enforcement.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities were down for the day. U.S. ISM manufacturing contracted and fell to a 10-year low. Corporate news was light. Treasury prices increased.

In Bond Markets, the 30-year Treasury yield closed lower at 2.24% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished lower at 1.74%. In Commodity Markets, the spot price of gold rose \$16.30 to \$1,482.00, and the price of crude oil fell \$0.49 to \$53.58.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 344 points or 1.3% to 26573. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 36 points or 1.2% to 2940, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 91 points or 1.1% to 7909.

2002 - The Washington, D.C.-area sniper attacks began, setting off a frantic manhunt lasting three weeks. John Allen Muhammad and Lee Boyd Malvo were finally arrested for killing 10 people and wounding three others; Muhammad was executed in 2009; Malvo was sentenced to life in prison.
