Deadliest Highway in Tennessee

A new study has named the deadliest highway in each state. The study is by Geotab, a fleet management business. It used crash data from 2008 to 2017. In Tennessee, the deadliest stretch of highway is Interstate 40 that connects Knoxville, Nashville, and Memphis. Nearly 52 people die on I-40 on average each year.

A History Moment with Joe Guy

Born in 1862 the son of former slaves, Jacob Lincoln "Jake" Cook rose from his humble beginnings to attend Fisk University and Knoxville College, graduating in 1888. Realizing the importance of education for southern black children, Cook returned to Athens in 1891, and with help from the Presbyterian Church founded a small 3-room school for African American students.

Later, a larger building was built near the present site of Lay-cock-Hobbs Funeral home, where soon teachers from Tennessee, Georgia, Texas, North Carolina, and as far away as the West Indies were recruited to teach the school's students, raising the level of education and turning out leaders in the black community who would go on to be teachers, business owners, government officials, and civic leaders.

Jake Cook never lived to see the full impact of his school, as he passed away in 1903 while teaching in North Carolina. The Athens School burned in 1925, but was replaced the following year by an even larger school that would bear the proud name of J.L. Cook High School.

A giant in African American education, Jake Cook and his first wife Anna Pocahontas are buried in Cedar Grove Cemetery.

1849 - Author Edgar Allan Poe died at age 40.

- **1911 -** Singer Vaughn Monroe was born. His many hit records included "Riders In The Sky," and "Let It Snow, Let It Snow." He died in 1973.
- **1916** The most lopsided football game on record took place when Georgia Tech clobbered Cumberland University of Tennessee, 222 to 0.
- **1957 -** Christian singer and song writer Michael W. Smith was born. His best-known songs include "Great Is The Lord" and "Friends."
- **1968 -** The Motion Picture Association of America adopted a film-rating system.
