More Joe Guy History

Athens, Tennessee

The Cherokee Indian Removal in 1836-38, known as the Trail of Tears, has its roots in a court case heard in McMinn County.

Jack Walker was a Cherokee leader and son of Calhoun founder Major John Walker. From a large home near the present Cleveland Walmart, Jack Walker joined his father in encouraging his fellow Cherokees to move west. But in September 1834, while riding through the present day Cedar Springs Community near Cleveland, Walker was assassinated by two Anti-Removal Cherokees, James Foreman and Anderson Springston. Foreman and Springston were arrested and brought to the McMinn County Jail in Athens.

The murder case was first dismissed due to the crime occurring within the limits of the Cherokee Nation. But the following year, the Tennessee Supreme Court, led by Judge John Catron, ruled that the Cherokee Nation was not sovereign and that it fell under the authority of Tennessee and the United States Government, effectively dooming any legal opposition to the Trail of Tears which began the following Summer.
