

U.S. equities ended the day lower, led by the industrials and technology sectors. President Trump announced that he will raise tariffs on Argentina and Brazil for steel and aluminum imports.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 268 points or 1.0% to 27,783. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 27 points or 0.9% to 3,114, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 97 points or 1.1% to 8,568.

In bond markets, the 30-year Treasury yield is trading higher at 2.27%, and the 10-year Treasury yield is trading higher at 1.82%. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$4.00 to \$1,468.70, and the price of crude oil rose \$0.79 to \$55.96.

Truck Collides with Tree


