Guilty Plea Given by Bennett

John W. Bennett of Decatur, has admitted killing four people in a deadly crash that occurred on May 6, 2016, on Highway 58 south of Decatur in Meigs County. According to Tennessee State Trooper Pat Patterson's report, Bennett was driving a dump truck southbound and was pulling an empty flat bed trailer that came loose from the truck and caused a chain reaction crash involving two vehicles. The victims in one vehicle were identified as Andrew Blackford, age 38, of Murfreesboro, and his passenger, Samantha Norris, age 37, of Maynardville. In the other vehicle was Christopher Denton, age 36, of Birchwood, along with his

passenger. Paula Stevens, age 62, of Dunlap. After the crash, Bennett fled the scene. He turned himself in to authorities in Bradley County several days later. He was charged with four counts of vehicular homicide and four counts of leaving the scene of a fatal

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities ended the day higher. The U.S. private sector added 67,000 jobs in November, well below the expectation. The Treasury yield rose as prices fell.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 147 points or 0.5% to 27,650. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 20 points or 0.6% to 3,113, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 46 points or 0.5% to 8,567.

In bond markets, the 30-year Treasury yield is trading higher at 2.22%, and the 10-year Treasury yield is trading higher at 1.77%. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$3.60 to \$1,480.80, and the price of crude oil rose \$2.23 to \$58.33.
