McMinn's 1st Traffic Death in 2020

McMinn County has recorded its first traffic death of the new

year. It happened around 7:30 Wednesday night on Highway 411 north of Englewood. A motorcycle rider traveling the wrong direction slammed into an oncoming Chevy Suburban, and was dead on the scene. The Tennessee Highway



Patrol identifies the victim as 69-year-old Mark Hart of Etowah. Trooper Eric Diaz says Hart was going southbound in the northbound lane near CR 410 when he hit the Suburban head on.



The motorcycle burst into flames. Hart was ejected onto the shoulder of the road. The driver of the Suburban was not injured. The Englewood Rural Fire Department responded.

More of 2019's Big Stories

- In 2019, Athens Federal Community Bank merged with Cap-Star Bank and changed its name to CapStar.
- The SplashPad opened at Athens Regional Park.
- Former President George W. Bush was in Athens in June to speak at the annual Athens Chamber of Commerce fundraising dinner.
- On August 1st, John McLain became the new CEO at Starr Regional Medical Centers of Athens and Etowah.
- In August, Athens voters said yes to raising the local sales tax by .75%. The vote was 871 for and 703 against. The major portion of the new revenue will go to the Athens City Schools for a proposed new "mega school" at City Park School.
- Governor Bill Lee and other dignitaries were in Athens in September to participate in the groundbreaking ceremony of the new McMinn Higher Education Center.
- Dean Foods, the parent company of Mayfield Dairy, reported it had filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection. Dean Foods said it may sell its business to the Dairy Farmers of America.
- Dr. Melanie Miller, director of the Athens City Schools, announced plans to retire effective next June 30th.
- In November, Joseph Wielzen was found guilty of first degree murder and rape in the death of Kelsey Burnette of Etowah in 2017. He was sentenced to life without parole.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JANUARY 3rd

1521 - Martin Luther was excommunicated from the Roman Catholic Church.

1892 - J.R.R. Tolkein, author of the fantasy novel "Lord of the Rings," was born.

1938 - The March of Dimes campaign to fight polio was started. It was founded by President Franklin D. Roosevelt as the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. It financed the research that produced the Salk and Sabin vaccines, which helped to prevent polio.

1959 - Alaska became the 49th state. The U.S. bought Alaska from Russia in 1867 for \$7.2 million which amounted to about 2-cents per acre.

1961- The United States severed diplomatic relations with Cuba.

1967- Jack Ruby, the man who fatally shot accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, died in a Dallas hospital.

1990 - Ousted Panamanian leader Manuel Noriega surrendered to U.S. forces, 10 days after taking refuge in the Vatican's diplomatic mission in Panama City.
