#### **Jobless Rate Rises in December**

- In McMinn County, unemployment in December was 3.8%, up from 3.5% in November.
- Meigs County's jobless rate took a high jump in December, going from 3.9% in November up to 5.4% in December.
- Monroe County's unemployment rate in December was 3.6%, up from 3.4% in November.
- Polk County recorded a 3.9% jobless rate in December, up from 3.4% in November.
- For Bradley County, the unemployment rate in December was 3.2%, up slightly from 3.1% in November.

# **Whiting Sues City of Athens**

Glenn Whiting, the Athens man who turned his downtown building into a billboard, is now suing the City of Athens. In the federal lawsuit, Whiting is suing the City, City Attorney Chris Trew, and City Manager C. Seth Sumner for First Amendment retaliation and violations of other state and federal laws. The lawsuit says Athens City officials abuse their authority through discretionary enforcement of law. It alleges that officials regularly single out individuals with whom they have personal disputes or political disagreements, and use the power of their positions to have laws enforced in a disproportionate manner against those individuals. It goes on to say that Sumner, Trew, and other Athens City officials have taken official actions, and have threatened to take further actions, against Whiting in retaliation for his recent expression of his political views at public meetings, as well as for expressing his political views via a display on the exterior wall of his building at the corner of Jackson St. and Madison Ave. The dispute stems from an incident that happened back in 2018 where a car was stolen from Whiting's property. Police Chief Cliff Couch says Whiting wasn't happy with the way it was investigated. Whiting is asking for damages, temporary and permanent relief, a declaration that the actions of the defendants were unconstitutional and illegal, and for the defendants to reimburse him for his attorney's fees. City Manager Sumner declined to comment, saying, "I have not been served with notice of a lawsuit and it would be unfair and inappropriate to comment on rumors."
