Former City Park Principal Jailed



A former principal at City Park Elementary School in Athens has been caught in a child sex sting. Mark Avery Pickel, 51, of Cleveland, is charged with transportation of child pornography in interstate commerce, interstate travel with intent to engage in a sexual act with a minor, and coercion and enticement of a minor. Prosecutor James Brooks says on Feb. 3rd an undercover online officer with the Chat-

tanooga Police Department was alerted that Pickel was operating on a social network platform in a group called "Loving Kids." The FBI was notified. The Chattanooga agent began corresponding with Pickel while leading him to believe the agent was a mother with an infant daughter. The prosecutor says Pickel sent a photo of himself to the undercover agent, and it was arranged that they would meet this past Tuesday at a lodging facility in northern Georgia. Pickel arrived at 11:30 a.m. and was arrested by waiting agents. Pickel was principal at City Park from 2009-2011. He had also been assistant principal at Polk County High School and principal of Vonore Elementary.


