POLICE/FIRE REPORTS FOR JANUARY

Members of the Athens City Council heard the reports on police and fire department activity for January at their Tuesday night meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 47 thefts in the city in January, 14 assaults, nine burglaries, three motor vehicle thefts, two sex offenses, and 51 arrests for drug crimes. Officers issued 131 citations for moving violations. That was down from 220 citations in January of last year. There were 55 traffic accidents with 11 injuries. There is currently one vacancy on the Athens police force.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 85 calls in January. Forty calls were for rescue and emergency medical service, ten were to fires, and there were 18 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$110,600.00. Most of that was a result of a house fire on Highway 39 West on January 21st.
- The City Council approved several appointments, including moving former mayor John Proffitt from an alternate on the Board of Adjust and Appeals to a Board member to fill a vacancy; appointing Wesley Kite to fill a vacancy on the Board of Zoning Appeals; and appointing Shannon Alvey, Larry Rhodes, Laura Sullivan, and Stephen Dick to the Council Advisory Committee.

More History With Joe Guy

The community of Reagan Station along Highway 11 just north of Niota traces its origins to General James Hayes Reagan, who came to McMinn County almost penniless in 1820. He worked for Irby Holt, a local minister, and eventually married Holt's daughter, Elizabeth.

Reagan worked his way up from store clerk to land owner, teacher, postmaster, bank president, General of the local militia, an early investor in the railroad, and state senator.

During the Civil War, Reagan was taken captive and held at Knoxville, where he died the day before his release. James Reagan is buried in the Browder Cemetery at the McMinn-Monroe County line, and his fine brick home remains standing nearby, known as the Reagan House, a testament to James Hayes Reagan's rags to riches story.
