EARLY VOTING ENDS

Early voting for the March 3rd Super Tuesday Primary Election has ended, and the turnout was slightly higher than it was in 2016. A total of 2959 people voted early in McMinn County. The party breakdown was 2250 Republicans, 706 Democrats, and 3 voters who asked for a "general" ballot which did not list either Republican or Democrat candidates. The number of voters living inside the city of Athens was 882. Voters outside Athens had the opportunity to vote on whether to raise the local option sales tax by .75%.

Update from Sheriff Joe Guy

McMinn Co Sheriff's deputies continue to seek Eric Armstrong, the former Chief of Police in Etowah, who is wanted on a misdemeanor arrest warrant stemming from a domestic incident near Etowah Sunday morning, where a female reported being assaulted at Armstrong's home on County Road 461. After investigating the situation as a domestic violence incident, an arrest warrant was issued against Armstrong, who had left the scene before the arrival of the deputies. The victim refused medical treatment by the responding ambulance, and was taken to another family member's residence.
