Virus Tips from Starr Regional

It probably feels as if coronavirus (or as it is officially known, COVID-19) is all anyone is talking about these days. As COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses like the seasonal flu continue to spread across the U.S., you also may feel a certain level of concern over how this disease could affect you or your loved ones, or if your local healthcare provider is prepared to respond to any local cases that may arise. Here is what Starr Regional Medical Centers of Athens and Etowah are doing.

- Starr Regional continues to work closely with the Tennessee Department of Health and the Hamilton County Health Department and to follow guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and
- Starr Regional has a robust emergency operations plan in place.
- Hand hygiene products are easily accessible throughout their facili-
- They are screening patients in their emergency department, inpatient clinics, and outpatient clinics based on CDC guidance.
- Staff treating a potential COVID-19 case are provided with all appropriate personal protective equipment to help prevent exposure.
- Patients with respiratory or have COVID-19 related symptoms are immediately provided with face masks.
- In the event that a potential COVID-19 case is identified, that individual will be placed in isolation.

More on the Virus from Starr

- People with fever, cough, sore throat, or other flu-like symptoms are not permitted to visit Starr Regional Medical Centers unless seeking medical Care.
- People who have traveled to a high-risk area for COVID-19 or had contact with a person known to be infected with COVID-19 will not be permitted to visit patients.
- Starr Regional Health & Rehabilitation, the skilled nursing and long -term care facility in Etowah, has elected to restrict all visitation at this time. Exceptions, only after screening has taken place, will include family of residents at end of life, hospice caregivers, home health care agencies, and other necessary caregivers. Family members are encouraged to connect with their loved ones through phone calls, text messages, or through video message options.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose.
- Clean and disinfect phones, computers, remote controls, and door-
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Work from home if possible and maintain a distance of six feet from others when possible.

- ✓ Governor Lee has instructed all school districts in Tennessee to close as soon as possible, with all schools expected to close by Friday, March 20th.
- ✓ Athens Utilities Board has suspended its policy of requiring customers to physically come into the office for a new or transferred service or a pay agreement. For at least the next two weeks, AUB's customer service representatives will be available to complete those transactions over the phone. AUB is asking customers to transact all normal business by phone or use the drive-through window.

- ✓ The Meigs County Senior Center will be closed until March 30th.
- ✓ The Athens City Council will have its monthly meeting at 6 p.m. today as scheduled.
- ✓ The McMinn Living Heritage Museum will be closed through March 28th.
- ✓ The McMinn County Clerk's Office will remain open, even though several other county offices may be closed. The kiosk will remain open if you need to renew your tags. Melinda King, the McMinn County Clerk, says they are keeping counters, supplies, and door handles wiped down as much as possible. She says if it's not urgent, consider waiting a couple of weeks to do your transaction. Take advantage of online and mail-in services. She also suggests you call the office before coming in to see if they can help you over the phone. The number is 423-745-4440.
- ✓ Athens City Schools will provide free drive thru breakfast and lunch at Ingleside and Westside schools through March 20th. Breakfast will be 9 a.m. to 10:55 a.m. and lunch is 11 to 1. Etowah City School also has drive thru breakfast and lunch each day.
