# **DENSO Employee Tests Positive**

Plant 701 at DENSO's Athens facility is back open after being closed temporarily after an employee tested positive for COVID-19. The building was closed over the weekend so a professional third-party cleaning service could thoroughly disinfect the building. A statement from DENSO says the employee last reported to work on April 10th and became symptomatic on April 16th. Because he was not working for six days prior to onset of symptoms, CDC guidelines do not require additional employees to self-quarantine. DENSO is asking its employees to self-monitor for fever or other symptoms and to stay home if they become ill.

## **CORONAVIRUS INFECTION UPDATE**

As of Monday afternoon, there have been 6 cases of the coronavirus in McMinn County. Four patients have recovered. At this point, results from 571 tests in McMinn County show 565 of the tests were negative. Monroe County has 11 cases, with one death and 7 recoveries. Meigs County reports 3 cases, with 2 recovered. Polk County has 5 cases, with 4 recovered. Bradley County has had 37 cases, one death, and 33 recoveries. Statewide, there are now 7,238 cases with 152 deaths, up four from Sunday.

#### MORE VIRUS-RELATED NEWS

Governor Lee has announced his order for Tennesseans to remain at home will expire April 30th. The vast majority of businesses in 89 counties will be allowed to re-open on May 1st. The other six counties include Shelby, Madison, Davidson, Hamilton, Knox, and Sullivan. Health departments in those counties will plan their own re-open strategies. Meanwhile most of Tennessee's 56 state parks will re-open on Friday, April 24th, for day-use only. Visitors will still have to practice social distancing while in the various parks.

# **Getting Tested for the Virus**

A total of 334 people were tested for the coronavirus Sunday afternoon at Athens Regional Park. Free drive-thru tests were given to anyone desiring to be tested. Meantime, free testing continues each day this week from 9 a.m. to 12 noon at the McMinn County Health Department off Highway 30 behind the National Guard Armory.

- 1509 England's King Henry VII died; he was succeeded by his 17-year-old son, Henry VIII.
- **1789 -** John Adams was sworn in as the first vice president of the United States.
- **1836 -** An army of Texans led by Sam Houston defeated the Mexicans at San Jacinto, assuring Texas independence.
- 1910 Author Samuel Langhorne Clemens, better known as Mark Twain, died in Redding, Connecticut, at age 74.
