# **Coronavirus Update**

The number of confirmed cases of the coronavirus in McMinn County now stands at 70. Four of those patients have recovered. Monroe County has 14 cases with 10 recovered and one death. Meigs County's count stands at 6 cases with 3 recovered. Bradley County has 46 cases, 37 recovered, and one death. The number of cases in Tennessee now stands at 10,052 with 188 deaths.

### MORE VIRUS-RELATED NEWS

Most restaurants in the Athens area have decided to delay re-opening their dining rooms for a few days, even though Governor Lee gave them the green light to open on Monday with a lot of restrictions. An informal survey by The Morning Fax determined that the Gondolier, Jenkins Grille, and Brownies have re-opened. Shoney's plans to open today. Restaurants planning to wait a bit before opening include Western Sizzlin, Bojangles (which will do a remodel of their dining area in May; their drive-thru will continue), Michael's, BJ's Snack Bar, Kibo's Japanese Restaurant, and Angela's Cuban Restaurant which is open for pickup and delivery; see ad below).

✓ The New Attitude clothing store in Downtown Athens is open again.



## **Tuesday's Market Report**

U.S. stocks ended the day lower. The health care sector led the decliners. Energy-sector stocks posted gains, treasury prices rose, and yields declined. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 32 points or 0.1% to 24,102. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 15 points or 0.5% to 2,863, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 122 points or 1.4% to 8,608. In bond markets, the 30-year Treasury yield is trading lower at 121% and the 10 year Treasury yield is trading lower at 61%. 1.21%, and the 10-year Treasury yield is trading lower at .61%. In Commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$5.10 to \$1,718.70, and the price of crude oil fell \$0.15 to \$12.63.

### **Another Minute of History**

A renovation was almost complete that cold day in November, 1964, when a fire started in the cupola of the old McMinn County Courthouse. The building had stood since 1875, having replaced the original structure built in 1827 and being damaged during the Civil War.

The fire spread slowly, but the many firemen who fought the blaze were unable to extinguish it as it devoured the decades-old wood. Throughout the day, firemen from all over the county worked to save the building. Fortunately, as the firemen fought the blaze, citizens joined courthouse employees in carrying vital and historic records out of the building, saving them for future generations.

The building's top floor and main courtroom were completely destroyed, with much of the lower floors sustaining heavy water damage.

Although a large group of citizens petitioned for a repair of the old building, it was torn down to make way for a new, spacious courthouse completed in 1967, that today is the centerpiece of downtown Athens, the 3<sup>rd</sup> brick courthouse to serve McMinn County.
