Covid-19 Virus Update

McMinn County has now had a total of 122 cases of the coronavirus; 32 of them have recovered. There have now been 8 deaths, all patients at Life Care Center of Athens. Bradley County has had a total of 72 cases of the virus; 51 have recovered and one has died. Monroe County's total cases stands at 31, with 17 recoveries and one death. Meigs County has had 22 cases of the coronavirus and 8 have recovered. In Tennessee, the total number of cases has reached 15.544 with 251 deaths.

JOBLESS RATE UP SLIGHTLY IN THE AREA

The unemployment rate dropped in two-thirds of Tennessee's counties in March, compared to February. The figures do not take into account the impact of the COVID-19 health emergency which did not start showing up until the 3rd and 4th weeks of March. In McMinn County, the unemployment rate in March was 4.2%, up from 4.1% in February. Meigs County posted a jobless rate of 5.2% in March, up from 5.1% in February. In Monroe County, the unemployment rate in March was 4.2%, up from 4.1% in February. Polk County's jobless rate in March was 4.2%, down from 4.5% in February. In Bradley County, the unemployment rate in March was 3.8%, up from 3.7% in February.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities ended the day mixed. Financials saw the biggest hit, and technology saw an increase. The Fed has reiterated its "whatever it takes" support for banks and the economy. Elon Musk has indicated Tesla could be moving its headquarters from California to Nevada.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 109 points or 0.4% to 24,222. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 0 points or 0.0% to 2,930, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 71 points or 0.8% to 9,192.

TODAY IN HISTORY - MAY 12th

1820 - Nursing pioneer Florence Nightingale was born. She was in charge of nursing British soldiers during the Crimean War. Soldiers called her "the lady with the lamp" because she carried her lamp as she walked the halls of their hospitals at night.

1907 - Actress Katharine Hepburn was born in Hartford, Conn.

1924 - Lawrence Peter Berra (better known as "Yogi") was born. He was a catcher for the New York Yankees and later managed both the Yankees and the Mets.

1929 - Songwriter and musician Bert Bacharach was born. He wrote such hits as "Raindrops Keep Falling On Your Head" and "I'll Never Fall In Love Again."

1932 - The body of the kidnapped son of Charles and Anne Lindbergh was found in a wooded area of Hopewell, N.J.

1937 - Britain's King George VI was crowned at Westminster Abbey.

1982 - Pope John Paul II was assaulted by a knife-wielding Spanish priest while visiting the shrine of Fatima in Portugal. (In 2008, the pope's longtime private secretary revealed that the pontiff had been lightly wounded.)

2003 - Fifty-nine Texas House Democrats fled to Oklahoma to prevent passage of a congressional redistricting bill.

2008 - An earthquake in China's Sichuan province killed some 70,000 people.
