COVID-19 Virus Update

As of Sunday, May 31st, Tennessee has had 23,006 cases of COVID-19, with 15,300 recoveries and 364 deaths. McMinn County reports 141 cases with 105 recoveries and 14 deaths. Rhea County shows 210 cases, with 114 recoveries. Meigs County reports 26 cases, with 21 recoveries. Monroe County's total is 64 with 45 recoveries and 2 deaths. Bradley County has 129 cases, 93 recoveries, and 1 death. Polk County reports 18 cases with 14

ATHENS TO HAVE 4th of JULY FIREWORKS

The City of Athens and the Athens Parks Foundation have announced that the Independence Day Fireworks show will be held on July 4th, at 9:30 p.m. and will be shot from the Athens Regional Park. A high-altitude show will be conducted. It's designed to be seen from a large viewing area around the Park. The highaltitude show will allow people to watch from an expanded area while practicing social distancing. Due to the nature of this show and the fact that these high-altitude shells require an expanded safety area, the park will be closed to people and traffic all day on July 4 including during the fireworks show. Viewers are advised and asked to find a safe location in the vicinity of the park to watch the show. Additional viewing directions will be released prior to July 4.

Motorists are advised to use alternate routes where possible.
- ◆ The Athens Farmers Market is now open. According to the City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department, the market will be open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3 to 6 p.m. and Saturdays starting June 6 from 9 to 11 a.m. at the Market Park Pavilion in downtown Athens. An official event celebrating the market's 10th season will tentatively be held Saturday, June 20 from 9 to 11 a.m. All Athens Farmers Market vendors are local producers. - ◆ Statistics released last week by the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development show a staggering increase in unemployment for each of Tennessee's 95 counties in April as many businesses closed to help slow the spread of COVID-19. This impacted some counties more drastically than others, but no area of Tennessee escaped the pandemic's effect on the state's workforce. Unemployment rates in April for the following counties were: McMinn County increased to 17.5%, up from 3.6% in March; Meigs County increased to 18.6%, up from 4.5% in March; Monroe County increased to 21.9%, up from 3.6% in March; Polk County increased to 13.4 %, up from 3.6% in March and Bradley County increased to 13.5%, up from 3.3% in March.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 1st

1792 - Kentucky became the 15th state in the union.

1796 - Tennessee became the 16th state in the union.

1813 - The Navy gained its motto when the mortally wounded commander of the frigate Chesapeake, Capt. James Lawrence, said "Don't give up the ship" during a losing battle with a British frigate.

1926 - Andy Griffith was born in Mount Airy, North Carolina. His biggest hit record was "What It Was, Was Football." He portrayed Sheriff Andy Taylor on the TV series "The Andy Griffith Show."

1964 - The U.S. Supreme Court banned prayers and Bible teaching in public schools on the "constitutional grounds" of separation of church and state.

1980 - CNN made its debut.

2009 - General Motors filed for Chapter 11, becoming the largest U.S. industrial company to enter bankruptcy protection.
