

Friday's Coronavirus Update

The number of confirmed cases of the coronavirus in Tennessee has now topped 25,000. The latest total is 25,120, up 298 from Wednesday. A total of 16,643 patients have recovered. The number of deaths is now 401, up 13 from Wednesday. McMinn County's total number of cases has increased to 146, up two from Wednesday. Of those, 107 patients have recovered and 14 have died. Monroe County has recorded its 3rd death. The totals in Monroe County are 71 cases with 53 recoveries and three deaths. Bradley County's total number of cases at this point is 166, with 105 recoveries and one death. In Polk Count there have now been 19 cases of the virus and 14 patients have recovered. Meigs County is reporting 27 cases with 22 recoveries. Rhea County's total is up to 217, with 166 patients recovered so far.

✓ Parades to honor the graduating seniors will take place in Athens and Etowah Saturday. TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 5th

1783 - The first ascent of an unmanned hot-air balloon took place in France. The balloon was made of pieces of cloth and paper buttoned together. It stayed in the air for 10 minutes until the hot air leaked through the button holes.

1925 - Singer Bill Hayes ("Ballad of Davy Crockett") was born.

1933 - President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed a bill abolishing the gold standard.

1945 - Don Reid, one of the Statler Brothers, was born.

1967 - The Six Day War broke out between Israel and her three Arab neighbors, Egypt, Jordan, and Syria. In that short war, Israel gained large areas of Arab land, including the Sinai Peninsula, Jordan's half of Jerusalem, and Syria's Golan Heights.

1968 - Senator Robert Kennedy was shot by Sirhan Sirhan in Los Angeles. He died the next day at the age of 42.
