# **COVID-19 Virus Update**

As of Sunday, June 7, Tennessee has had 26,381 cases of COVID -19, with 17,222 recoveries and 418 deaths. McMinn County reports 150 cases with 110 recoveries and 14 deaths. Rhea County shows 218 cases, with 171 recoveries. Meigs County reports 27 cases, with 22 recoveries. Monroe County's total is 75 with 60 recoveries and 4 deaths. Bradley County has 199 cases, 121 recoveries, and 2 deaths. Polk County reports 21 cases with 16 recoveries.

# Statement from Ministerial Assoc.

The Athens Area Ministerial Association has issued a statement against racism. Here is part of the statement:

As people of Christ, we believe that we are to proclaim Good News, hope to the world, and the words of love that state that we are each other's neighbor. We continue to hear and affirm Christ's call upon us that we are to be a light to the world.

Therefore, we stand together. We recognize our skin color and our backgrounds are often different. But we also recognize that those differences should never be the basis for de-humanizing another person. We come together to bear witness that we cannot, as people of faith, abide any system or ideology that views people through racist lenses.

As followers of Jesus Christ, we cannot accept these actions that resulted in the death of George Floyd, nor can we accept the violence perpetuated in his name. His death does not deserve violence, it deserves justice.

We painfully admit that throughout the history of this country, people of color have been treated as "less than" by means official and unofficial. With repentance, we have to acknowledge that changes have to be made in our country on a fundamental level--we have to learn and teach that all people are people of Divine worth. We stand with the men and women, police and protester alike, who recognize George Floyd's death is an atrocity. We add our voices and prayers to those around the country who want a better day for our country.

#### **TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 8th**

**1783** - Iceland's Laki volcano blew its top and continued to spew lava for eight more months. This was one of the most violent of volcanic eruptions which killed 9,350 people and caused a famine which lasted until 1790.

**1786** - Commercial ice cream was manufactured for the first time -- in New York City.

**1808** - The *Phoenix*, the largest ocean-going steamboat in the world, left New York Harbor for Philadelphia, PA. It was the first ocean voyage ever taken by a steamboat. John Stevens built the mammoth boat.

**1872** - U.S. Congress authorized the penny postal card.

**1951** - Paul Bobel, Werner Braune, Erich Naumann, Otto Ohlendorf, Oswald Pohl, W. Schallenmair & Otto Schmidt, the last Nazi war criminals, were hanged by U.S. officials at Landsberg Fortress (prison).

**1969** - NFL Commissioner Pete Rozelle announced that a single-league schedule would replace the separate NFL and AFL schedules in 1970.

**1982** - On his visit to England, Ronald Reagan went horse-back riding with Queen Elizabeth II, lunched with Prime Minister Thatcher, and became the first U.S. President to address the British Parliament.
