Covid-19 Virus Update

There was another jump in the number of COVID-19 cases in Tennessee. The latest total is 27,575. That's up 631 from Monday. 18,013 patients have recovered and there have now been 435 deaths. McMinn County's total has gone up 6, now standing at 159 cases with 120 recovered and 14 deaths. Officials at Life Care Center of Athens now say their facility is COVID-19 "free". There are currently no cases of the coronavirus among residents or staff members. Rhea County's totals are 219 cases and 202 recoveries. Meigs County has 27 cases and 22 recoveries. Monroe County reports 75 cases, 61 recoveries, and 4 deaths.
