

Latest Update on Coronavirus

Tennessee's coronavirus cases continue to rise. As of Wednesday afternoon, there have been 27,869 cases statewide. This is an increase of 294 from Tuesday with 18,516 recoveries and 436 deaths. McMinn County's total is unchanged from Tuesday. Meigs County has 27 cases with 24 recoveries, Rhea County has 220 cases with 206 recoveries. Monroe County stands at 75 with 61 recoveries and 4 deaths. Bradley County has 238 cases with 158 recoveries and 2 deaths. Polk County now has 24 cases with 19 recoveries.



1770 - Captain James Cook, commander of the British ship Endeavour, "discovered" the Great Barrier Reef off Australia by running onto it.

1864 - German composer Richard Strauss was born.

1880 - The first woman member of the U.S. Congress, Jeannette Rankin, was born in Montana. She created a furor by becoming the only member of Congress to vote against a declaration of war on Japan following the attack on Pearl Harbor.

1910 - Undersea explorer Jacques Cousteau was born.

1913 - Football coach Vince Lombardi was born. He was head coach of the Green Bay Packers from 1959 until, 1969. Under his leadership, the Packers won two Super Bowl games. Lombardi's record at Green Bay was 141 wins, 39 losses, and 4 ties.

1927 - Aviator Charles Lindbergh was welcomed home by President Calvin Coolidge after making history's first non-stop flight across the Atlantic Ocean, to Paris.

1939 - Country singer Wilma Burgess was born. Her biggest hit was "Misty Blue."

1977 - Seattle Slew won the Belmont Stakes, capturing the Triple Crown.

2001 - Timothy McVeigh, 33, was executed by injection at the federal prison in Terre Haute, Indiana, for the 1995 Oklahoma City bombing that killed 168 people
